

In his previous time at Civitas, Naylor led some of the firm's most notable projects spanning the Western U.S., including the design of Denver's Commons Park, Clark County Government Center in Las Vegas, and the realization of a 46-acre TOD at Belleview Station in Denver's Tech Center. Between that tenure and his current role, he founded and directed his own firm, Oak Hill Studio, for several years and worked with Denver firms including Parsons Brinckerhoff. He is known for his creative leadership and a collaborative, inclusive style that has made him a mentor to young professionals both at Civitas and through his work as an instructor at the Graduate School of Landscape Architecture at the University of Colorado, Denver.
